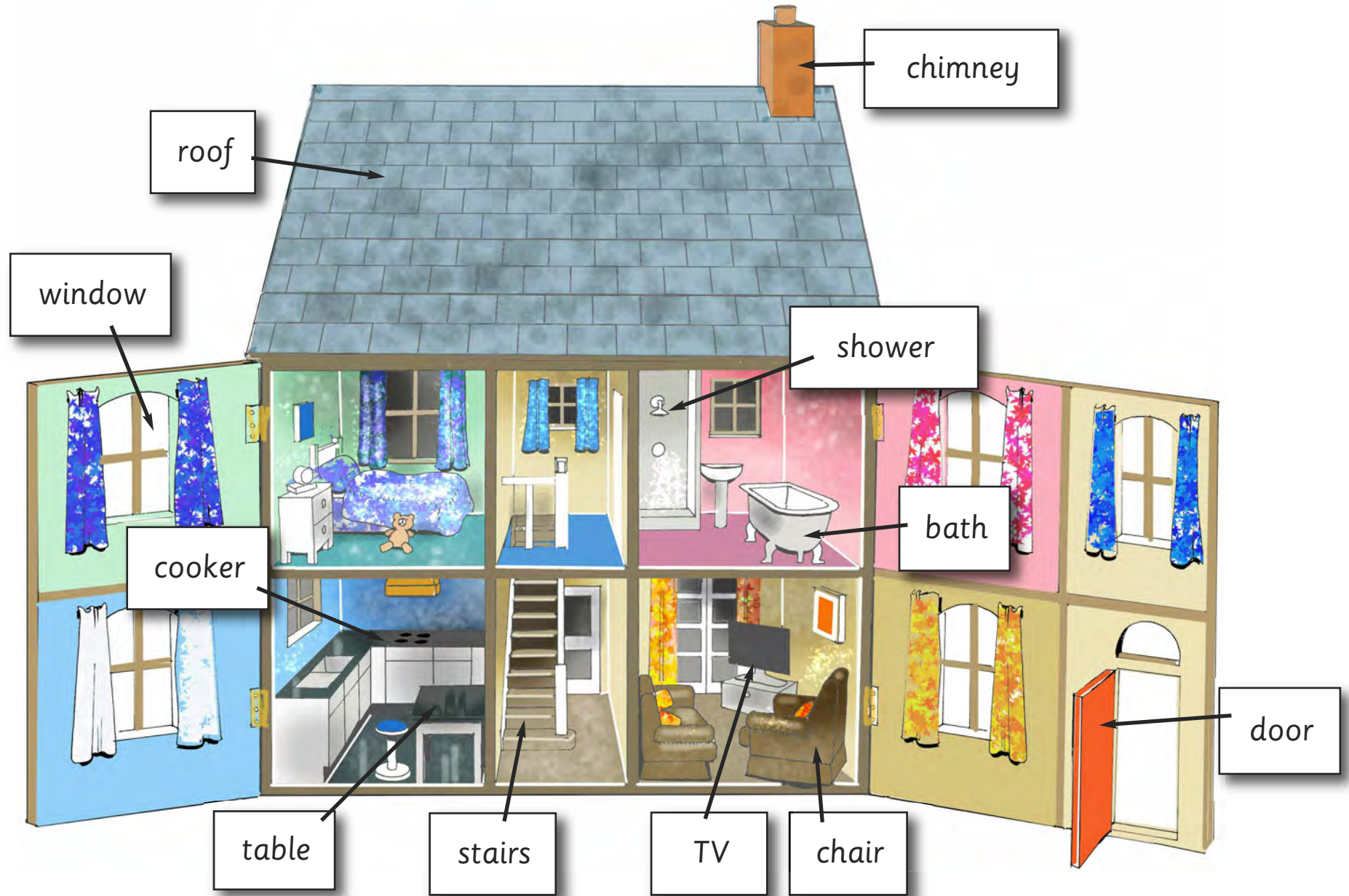

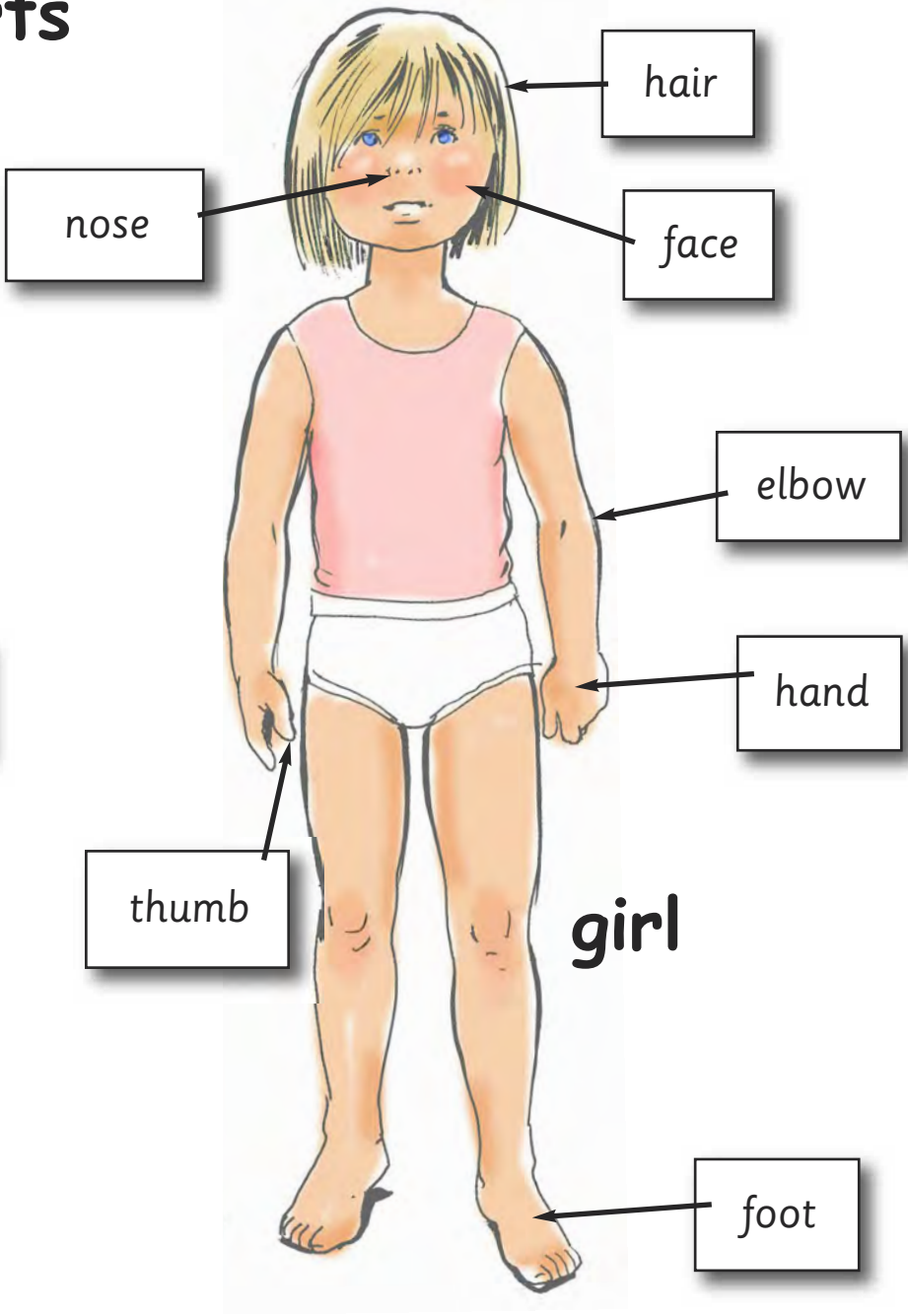
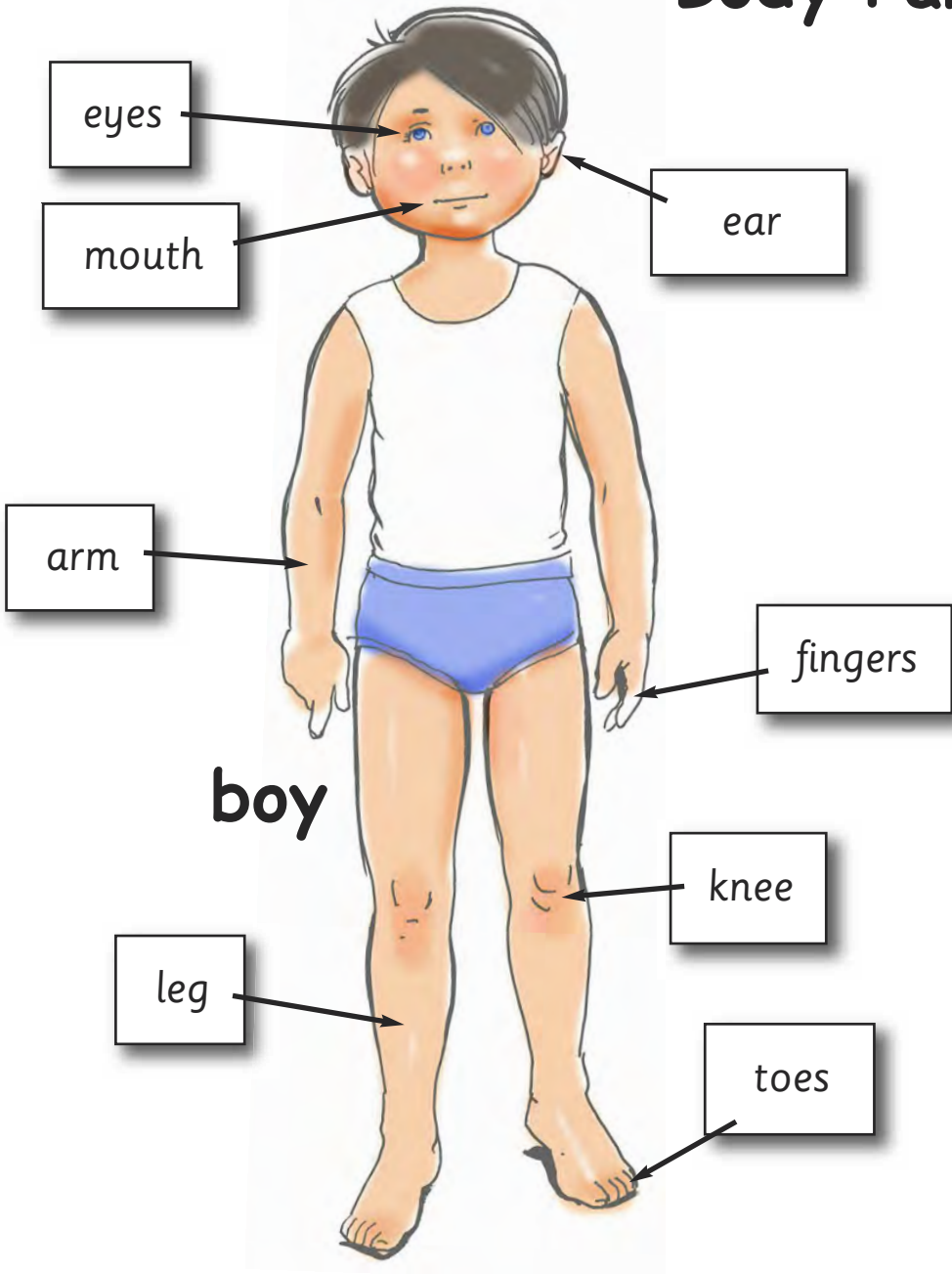

I drew a picture of my mum.

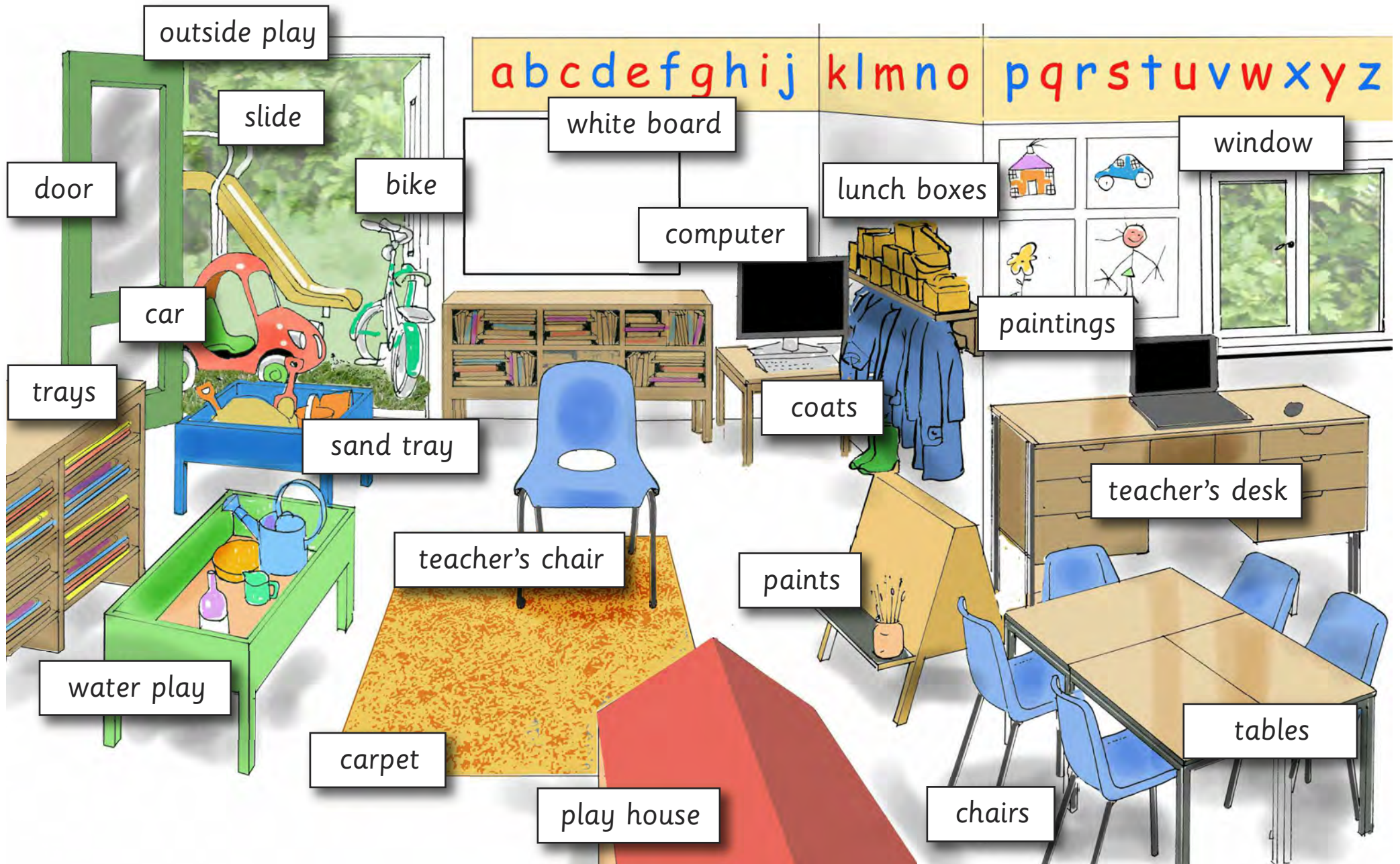


Jack and I played with the Lego.
